Changes to O'Connor Point Beach Access

The gate at O'Connor Point will now always remain locked. Residents wishing to access the O'Connor Point Beach will be required to obtain a Pass Card and Pass Code from the municipal office in advance to open the gate. Access is restricted to residents with appropriate access requirements and are advised that the gate should never be propped open or left unlocked.

The gate pass code is operational

only between noon and 8:00 pm daily from Wednesday June 30, 2021, to Monday September 6, 2021. If on the property anytime other than the specified hours, your privileges to use O'Connor Point will be revoked and you may be charged with trespassing.

We hope you enjoy your time using the beach and remind you that all the Terms of Use listed on the Pass Card must be followed.

On to Our Season Seven!

Our 2020 Gardening Season started out rather late at June 01 due to the Corona-19 Virus and this year was no exception with a slight advantage of our opening 2 weeks earlier on May 15th. The Thunder Bay District Health Department and our Shuniah Office allowed our Community Gardens to open activities based on the conditions of 2020. That is, to have the same operating regulation of signing in/signing out, masks, social distancing, sanitary chemistry and the maximum of 10 persons in the gardens at any one time.

We took an adventure early in April and applied for a \$5000 Grant from Scott's Grow for Good Gardening Award. Sadly we did not win but the company did send a consolation gift of 6 packets of special garden seeds which were offered to the members. Beet seeds seem to win every time.

Our gardening enthusiasm remains strong and in no time at all, last years' membership filled out their garden application and consent forms and we were off and digging. As usual there were 3 gardens spare and the order of issue was to wait for any new members. This happened easily by word of mouth

and by the end of May all gardens are in use.

The first order of business was to call for a grass whipping army (with supervisors) to clean up around the garden boxes and load the Compost Station. Watering hoses and nozzles were checked for wear and

nozzles were checked for wear and tear and installed at the four stations. We added a special "extra" to the roto-tilling by offering each and every garden a special 3 bags of sheep manure to be applied before plantings.

The Josh Klukie Memorial Garden #1 florals and the Herb Garden #2 survived the winter very well. There is a listing of caretakers in the field desk to spell off any one person having to tend these gardens for more than one week at a time. As always, the herbs are grown to support donations to the needy kitchens of Thunder Bay and they are very well received.

Last year at end of season we tallied 779 entry signatures. To date we have scored 222 signaturesand we have only just begun to grow. Let's hope our Milkweed plants get our old friends back from Mexico...they know the way by memory.

June 18th, 2021 - It is once again time for Municipal work crews and private contractors to begin working on improving and maintaining our roadways and associated infrastructure. Please slow down when approaching work areas, construction workers could be hidden behind equipment and materials.

Trees & Roadside Brush Control If you notice a tree or brush on Municipal property that poses a safety hazard, please contact the Public Works office. Residents are also encouraged to contact local utilities if trees on private property are interfering with overhead wires.

The equipment utilized to complete the roadside clearing quite often leaves behind an unsightly aesthetic appearance. If you would like to avoid mechanical brushing in your area, residents are strongly encouraged to keep roadside trees, branches; shrubs etc. trimmed back a minimum of 5 feet from the traveled edge of the road.

Dust Control

Approximately forty percent of Shuniah's roads have a gravel riding surface; therefore, dust is likely to occur, especially during the months of July and August. The Public Works Department utilizes calcium

and magnesium chloride dust suppressants to alleviate the amount of dust and reduce gravel road base loss. The nature of the summer season is such that dust cannot be eliminated, residents should know the Municipality is doing everything it can to minimize road dust.

<u>Illegal Dumping of Yard Waste</u> <u>and Debris</u>

Residents are required to dispose of yard waste and debris at the Shuniah Landfill Sites, not alongside roadways and trails that lead into the bush that are quite often private property. If you do not want the material in your yard, chances are neither do your neighbors.

The Public Works Department would like to thank those who have shown patience and understanding during the construction and repairs of the various projects that will be completed this season. Improved Cellular Coverage:

Council has negotiated a lease agreement with Bell to improve cellular coverage along Hwy 11/17 in Shuniah with the addition of a new mobility tower off of MacGregor Road.

Grant for Fire Department:

The Fire Chief was successful with a grant application for \$5,200 to support increased training opportunities and the establishment of a virtual inspection program. This was part of the Ontario Fire Marshall's Fire Safety Grant program.

Provincial Delegations with Provincial Ministers:

Council has submitted delegation requests with Ministers of Education(EDU), Finance(MOF) and Environment, Conservation and Parks(MECP). These delegations are an opportunity for members of Shuniah Council to meet one-onone with Ministry's to voice their concerns with the Provincial government. The MECP is proposing changes that will severely limit the Conservation Authority's ability to ensure people and property are protected from natural hazards and will require an additional Community Advisory Board, an unnecessary allocation of resources towards additional regulation. While the EDU is not currently active in accelerating their Pupil Accommodation Reviews we are always looking for opportunities to remind the Province of the importance of rural schools in Northern Ontario. The MOF of course

needs to be reminded of the growing impact of transferring Provincial programs and services onto property taxes. What it comes down to is municipalities having to pay for more of people services (health care, ambulance, social services, etc.) that were originally paid for by senior levels of government while still being obligated to fund municipal property services.

OPP Detachment Board Framework:

Shuniah is currently working with area municipalities that receiving policing services from the OPP. The Solicitor General is requiring OPP Detachments to submit revised Police Service Board framework recommendations based on the new Community Safety and Policing Act.

Parks and Recreation Infrastructure/Programs:

While the past year has taken a toll on our community in ways that will forever change us, Council has been looking for opportunities to move projects forward from our Master Parks and Recreation Plan. Through a variety of new Federal and Provincial funding, mainly the Provincial's COVID-19 Safe Restart and Infrastructure's New Building Canada Fund, Shuniah has been able to move forward with numerous developments: new playground equipment, expansion of trails and lighting to Wild Goose Park, plans for a newly proposed multi-use pavilion and numerous other smaller projects to support future programming at our MacGregor Rec Centre.
