Spend a Night in Andean Bolivia Without Leaving Shuniah Township



Yin yoga focuses on the deep connective tissue through a slow, cooling practice. The goal is not to stretch" but to "stress" the connective tissue" between the muscles and fascia. Yin yoga is therapeutic for the joints and helps with flexibility and mobility. Yin Yoga is a slow-paced, therapeutic style of yoga. Yin postures are more passive postures, mainly done on the floor either seated or lying down. There are no sun salutations, no planks, no warriors, no jump throughs! There is in fact no dynamic movement and usually no standing poses at all. Yin Yoga is unique in that you are asked to relax into the posture, allowing the body to soften and release naturally without pushing or straining. It is not uncommon for postures to be held for three to five minutes, even 10 minutes at a time. The time spent in these postures is much like time spent in meditation, as the mind shifts from yang to yin, or from active to passive. 

This was the Year that was...with a little help from our friends by Peter Tracz, Convenor

On the last required sign-in of Sept 25, there were 935 signatures for members attending our Community Gardens. I must admit to having quite a satisfied feeling on my entering these gardens during these past many months. We have a beautiful enclosure, garden shed for equipment and tools, and a water supply second to none. In and above all this year's covid restrictions, required masking and safe distancing, inoculations, fire restrictions, drought and other worldly troubles, we have enthusiastic membership called Soil Mates.

We had the pleasure again this year of having the Rec Center Shuniah Brownies and Girl Guides who gave, (in addition to their cookie selling time), help with coiling coil and tving up the many lengths of water hoses and tucking them into storage. They helped trim down the flower beds on our Memorial Garden and also harvested the Milkweed plant pods to grow plantings themselves next year. We all know that the Monarch butterflies will return to their original birth place and to that same milkweed garden...all

the way from southern Mexico.

Next year we will have a surprise Spring feature in that the Shuniah Brownies and Guides will have planted their spare spring bulbs in our Soil Mates Memorial Garden as well as in the digital sign foundation flower boxes. The colour and variety of bulbs symbolize the blue and white of the Girl Guides. There are snow drops, scilla, narcissus, tulips and hyacinths. They will not bloom all at once but what a way to start

We do need some consulting next year in that we have recurring garden soil pests in almost every garden. The soils, surely after 7 years, need replenishing or reconditioning and we must do it in a nonchemical way. The compost station has a new soil capacity for only 2 gardens but the exchange must be in total volume.

My deepest thanks to each and every member for their help in the many work parties to keep the gardens in tip top shape. Even at this late date, we have had an inquiry for membership in next year's season.

The First Shuniah Guiding Units are having a blast this fall!

The girls are so excited to be back to in-person guiding that the fun just doesn't stop! The great fall weather really helped us to meet outside and do a lot of different activities. We have had both regular meetings at the MacGregor Rec Centre AND some weekend activi-

We did two weekend hikes, one to the Bluffs and one to Cascades. The bluffs hike allowed us to enjoy the fall colours and the views over the city and the lake. The girls hunted for conifer cones and examined seed heads of different plants. During the Cascades hike the girls practiced some map reading using both the posted maps along the trails and digital maps on phones. We went down to the water to explore the rocks and throw sticks in the water to see what route they took through the falls. During the walk the girls practiced some of their hiking songs as part of our fall focus on guiding traditions.

Meanwhile, our weekly meetings at MacGregor Rec centre have included team-based running games to introduce the girls to each other and build solidarity in their patrols. The girl guides have two patrols and the Brownies have 3. Brownie patrols are called circles. These are groups to organize the girls for projects and activities. For example, the Girl Guides are working on developing their outdoor and survival skills. Each patrol had to build a shelter with a tarp, poles and rope for one activity. We are hoping to strengthen their teamwork and leadership skills after nearly a year apart.

Our fall service projects have been at the MacGregor rec centre. The girls aim to do service projects in each season. This fall, we spruced up the rec centre picnic table with a fresh

Our students and staff have worked hard on developing routines and getting use to daily school life again after so many months away. The first two months have flown by, with not only a focus on literacy and mathematics in the classroom, but a strong focus on mental health strategies and outdoor education (often in our new outdoor classroom!) as well. The school has been full of action, as we have already had numerous excursions, school clubs, events, and extra-curricular teams keeping us busy.

Our students participated in the annual Terry Fox Walk Run/Walk in September, and thanks to the amazing generosity of our Shuniah community, raised \$978 dollars for the Terry Fox Foundation for Can-

cer research.

Our students have already had an opportunity to participate in a number of Lakehead Elementary Athletics events including Soccer, Cross-Country Running, Ultimate Frisbee and Flag Football. 


