Tutoring Assistance Program for Shuniah Families

The Municipality of Shuniah has developed a program to provide additional educational assistance to students who are struggling, and families looking for support.

1. Eligible Shuniah Families may receive funding for children in grade K-12, to reduce the cost of outside tutoring programs.
 - o Parent of child must be a Shuniah property owner.

- o The maximum subsidy amount per student is \$50 per session per week to a maximum amount of \$1,000.
- o Funding at this time will only be for recognized organizations located within the Thunder Bay District or the school board.
- o Funding will be available for tutoring services provided after October 1st, 2021.

- o Proof of tutoring registration is required to be eligible.

Interested families are required to submit applications to the municipal office or via email. Funding is first come first serve as limited funding is available. Apply early!

COVID-19: Know the facts

How can I protect myself, my family, and my community?



Stay home when sick. Do not go to work or any public places. If you are out and start to feel sick, go home and separate yourself from others immediately (this is called self-isolating). Get tested for COVID-19.



Wear a mask or face covering that covers your nose, mouth and chin with no gaps. Wear it in all indoor public spaces and when physical distancing is not possible. Continue to practice physical distancing.



Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces around the house that people touch a lot (e.g. door handles, cell phones).



Wash your hands often with soap and warm water. When this isn't possible, use hand sanitizer.



Practice physical distancing. Stay away from busy places. Stay at least 2 meters (6 feet) away from people outside your household or social circle.



Be prepared to self-isolate or provide support for loved ones who are sick. Have a care plan as well as enough supplies to last 14 days.



Cover your coughs and sneezes using your sleeve or a tissue. Wash your hands right away.



Be extra careful around people who are at higher risk.

Winter Safety Message

Snow Removal Information

Shuniah Public Works

The following information is provided to assist residents of Shuniah in understanding the Municipalities program for winter maintenance of roads. We hope that this information will also help people appreciate some of the challenges in keeping the roads safe and open for travel.

When a major snowstorm occurs, all drivers throughout the Municipality are faced with deteriorating driving conditions at the same time. Without consideration to the limitations of a snow maintenance operation and regardless of the weather, we understand that drivers expect all roadways to be cleared and safe within the shortest possible period of time. We agree that rapidly cleared roads are very important, both for safe travel, and to facilitate the handling of emergencies by fire, ambulance and police operations.

The plow operators are assigned a designated route, of which may contain several classes of roads- class 3 roads are considered the major routes and class 5 roads are considered to be the lower volume lightly traveled roads. The routes are designed to clear roads in a systematic way that generally gives priority to class 3 roads and class 4 - 5 collector roads with steep hills and curves. This method also provides the best access for Emergency Services.

The municipality is required to follow Ontario Regulation 239/02 Minimum Maintenance Standards for Municipal Highways. These maintenance standards including the level of service to be provided are based on the classification of a particular highway/road. Speed limits and traffic volumes determine their classification. Current municipal roadway traffic volumes do not meet the set criteria for Highway Classes 1 & 2 therefore, all of the road classifications fall within the range of 3-5.

The specific course of action (including salting and sanding) will be determined by the Roads Supervisor, depending on snow depth, type of snow, drifting, icy conditions, etc. It is the Municipality's objective to plow all roads within 12 hours of a snowstorm's completion which exceeds the minimum standards set by the Province. In cases of heavy snowfalls, accidents, mechanical breakdowns and / or other problems, these objectives may not be met.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why do plows push snow into drive-ways? Why can't the operator lift the blade in front of my residence? Answer -Snow must be pushed to the side of the road to clear the road for traffic; all plow trucks are set up to push snow to the right. Sometimes it is necessary to make several passes with the snowplow during a storm. Other instances may require the banks to be pushed back to allow room for more snow or to allow for drainage during the spring thaw.

Homes that are located near corners, intersections and cul-de-sacs may receive more snow deposit in driveway entrances than homes located on straight stretches of road, of which is unfortunately unavoidable in most instances.

Why can't the Municipality sand the sides of the road where I walk? Answer - Roads are maintained for vehicles, not walkers. The sanders are designed with the applicator on the driver's side of the vehicle in order to apply sand to the center of the road.

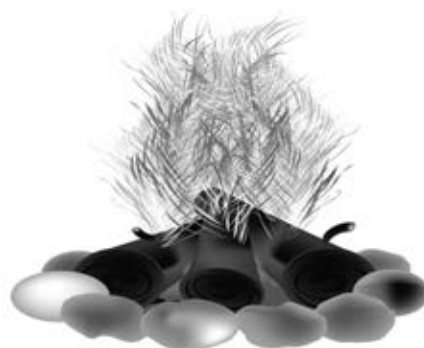
Mailboxes & Snow

• Mailbox posts need to be sturdy enough to handle snow thrown by the snowplow. If a mailbox is damaged by plowed snow, repair or replacement is the homeowner's responsibility.

• Mailboxes that have been directly hit by a snowplow blade will be repaired or replaced by the Municipality with a standard mailbox.

Obstructing the Roadways

Council passed By-law No. 2051-01, which states that, no person shall obstruct or cause any obstruction to any highway, roadway, public lane or bridge within the Municipality. This by-law also indicates that snow, dirt, rubbish or garbage of any kind cannot be placed or plowed onto the roadway and drainage ditches.

First Shuniah Girl Guides Take on the Great Outdoors!

First Shuniah Girl Guides The First Shuniah Girl Guides had a really productive fall! We tried to focus on outdoor activities to promote fresh air and social distancing. The Girl Guides supplemented their hike with a 'survival challenge'. After a short hike, each group of guides had to make a fire and build a shelter using a tarp and ropes. They had to find all the materials for the fire in the forest. They were only allowed a lighter or matches, no fire starters. They were all really successful and learned about heat and wind and their role in making us feel warm or cold. The girls also were introduced to the big chore of feeding their fire once they got it going! Along with these lessons, we warmed ourselves up and enjoyed some tea and cookies. To celebrate the Christmas season, the girls prepared skits to perform for each other. The Brownies and Sparks performed a wonderful story about animals snuggling into a warm mitten and stretching it to a great size. Each girl played the part of a different animal. Guider Amanda helped them

make their own costumes. They looked fantastic! The Guides worked to develop skits on the history of Guiding, which is over a century old! They will keep polishing them to perform for us in February for international guiding and scouting day. We completed our holiday celebration with a big cookie exchange. We had well over a dozen varieties to share with each other! The girls put a lot of effort into developing their baking skills and we all really enjoyed the results. The girls also did some crafts and made some Christmas cards. Earlier in November the Guides and a few brownies learned knitting and crocheting. Several went on to make Christmas gifts using their new skills. We didn't think such a quiet activity would appeal to a few of the more rambunctious girls. But we were amazed that most of the groups really enjoyed the fiber arts. We will definitely be keeping this activity going to promote some down time for the group! For our service project this season the girls visited the Regional Food Distribution Association to decorate cookies for Christmas hampers. They had a ton of fun with the icing. We received a tour of the facility from Sunshine, one of the workers there. The girls really liked the conveyor belt system to move boxes around the huge warehouse.

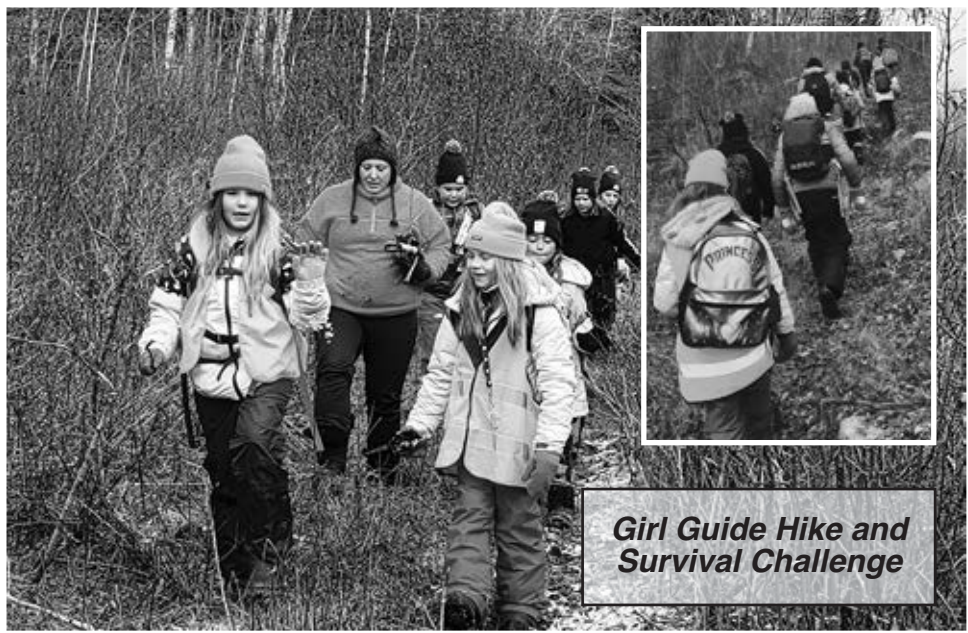
