

March 29, 1873 The Ontario Legislature passed an Act to organize the Municipality of Shuniah consisting of the Townships of Pardee, Crooks, Blake, Paipoonge, Neebing, McIntyre, Mac-Gregor, McTavish also Village of Prince Arthur's Landing, Thunder Cape and the islands north of the American border. Hence, Shuniah became the first incorporated municipality in what is now the north-western portion of Ontario. Peter Johnson Brown was elected as the first Reeve of the Municipality.

Over the years, as the population grew the individual townships became incorporated and as of 1976 the Municipality of Shuniah was changed into the Township of Shuniah consisting of the MacGregor

and MacTavish wards.

## **SHUNIAH PUBLIC WORKS 2023 Capital Improvements**

Administration and Council recognize the importance of maintaining and improving municipal infrastructure. A detailed list summarizing this year's roadway, building and waste management projects are included below for your information.

#### Roads:

- West Loon Drive 2.5 km gravel section, drainage improvements, Geo-grid install at select locations for sub-base stabilization and new asphalt riding surface -Summer/Fall2023
- Haugen Road 0.5km, drainage improvements and replacement of existing asphalt riding surface - Summer 2023
- Lakeshore Drive/Spruce River Road 18km, engineering design and tender document preparation for the future rehabilitation of the existing asphalt riding surface and associated drainage improvements—Summer/Fall 2023
- Sunrise Beach Drive, municipal drain construction July2023
- Spruce River Road Railway Crossing Upgrades, new pre-cast concrete riding surface and asphalt approaches – Summer 2023

#### **Bridges/Wharfs:**

- West Loon Lake Wharf, dredging of boat launch -June 2023
- Bi-Annual Bridge Inspections, ongoing mandatory structure inspection program Fall 2023

#### **Waste Disposal Sites:**

- McTavish Landfill: engineering and application submission for capacity expansion – Fall 2023
- Hwy. 527 Disposal Site; Environmental Compliance Approval Amendment; site improvements, consultation and engineering - On-going

#### **Equipment:**

No planned replacements in 2023.

Use a good firing base such as a pail or wheelbarrow filled with earth or sand.



Choose a clear, open site away from obstacles. Consumer Fireworks must be at least 30 metres from any structure or property line.



Keep water nearby: dispose of used fireworks and debris in a pail of water.



NEVER try to light a firework or hold a lit firework in your hand, other than a sparkler. Never try to relight a firework that

did not go off. Never try to fix a




firework that is defective.

Do not fire in windy conditions





Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of the Fireworks By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine or penalty as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990 Chapter P. 33, as amended.

Being a by-law to regulate the sale of freworks within the limits of the Municipality of Shuniah, and for regulating the setting off of freworks in the said Municipality, and for the holding of freworks displays and for prescribing the conditions under which freworks displays may be held under such permit, and to repeal By-law Number 1982-99.

Revised April 2023

Consumer fireworks are low-hazard and designed for recreational use.



Display fireworks are high-hazard and designed for professional use.

Special effect pyrotechnics are highhazard and designed for professional use.



- Fireworks are not permitted to be set off during an imposed fire ban.
- At least two operators of the display shall constantly be on duty during the setting off of freworks.
- Persons not actively engaged in the setting off of fireworks shall be kept behind lines at least 150 feet from the point where the fireworks are set off.
- No person shall hold a display of or set off consumer fireworks except on the day preceding, the day of and the day following:
  - Victoria Day
  - Canada Day

- Discharge of fireworks is restricted to between dusk and 11:59pm on the designated days, except New Years Eve discharge of fireworks is restricted to between dusk and 1:00am of the
- No person shall set off any consumer fireworks on or into any building, structure, automobile, highway or any land used for school purposes.



- No person shall display, offer for sale or sell consumer fireworks within the Municipality of Shuniah except on:
- Victoria Day,
   Canada Day,
- Ganada Day,
   Civic Holiday,
- Labour Day
- New Years Eve, or for a period of 14 calendar days immediately preceding these days.
- Sales of fireworks is prohibited to anyone under the age of 19 years.
- Consumer fireworks may not be stored for more than 30 days prior to any of the lawful dates for the sale thereof and not longer than 30 days after such dates.
- Only fireworks authorized by the Explosives Regulatory Division, Natural Resources Canada are permitted to be sold or used.

### User Fees By-law Update The Municipality of Shuniah has updated its User

The Municipality of Shuniah has updated its User Fees By-law with 2023 rates and fees for specific municipal services and activities provided by the municipality.

User Fees assist in covering all or a portion of the cost of delivering specific services therefore alleviating the financial impact on tax and user ratepayers.

The by-law changes were discussed by Council at its March 14, 2023 meeting and approved on March 28, 2023. Some changes include:

#### Effective June 1, 2023, Landfill Permit Fee:

- Landfill Permit Fee increased to \$40
- number of free clean ups have been reduced from two to one

#### Effective June 1, 2023, Tipping Fees:

- Single axel trucks and passenger vehicles with less than 3 cubic metres increased to \$8 per cubic metre
- Single axel trucks and passenger vehicles with more than 3 cubic metres increased to \$100
- Tandem Trucks increased to \$300
- Tri-axel trucks increased to \$400
- Trucks larger than tri-axel increased to \$550
- Hourly attendant rate for outside of operation hours increased to \$75

#### **Effective June 1, 2023, MacGregor Hall Rental:**

- Damage deposit for a dry event is \$100
- Damage deposit for a event involving alcohol is now \$300
- Rental fees for a private event up to 4 hours is increased to \$125
   o Fees include use of kitchen
- Rental fees for a private event over 4 hours is increased to \$200

   Fees include use of kitchen
- New fee for set up and take down of tables and chairs \$100
- New increase of rental fees 25% for events held on a Statutory Holiday

#### **Effective April 1, 2023, Planning Applications:**

- All planning applications will be subject to a \$500 pre-consultation
- Application fees have been reduced by \$500 to account for the preconsultation fee.








#### Shuniah Judo Players Enter First Tournament! by Martha Dowsley

The Judo Club has had an exciting spring. After many months of fitness and skills training, we participated in our first Judo Competition at Neebing Community Centre on April 15th. Seven students from our club fought in the match that hosted teams from as far away as Marathon and Dryden. There were about 50 other judoka in the competition, including Shuniah's own Savage family (of Thunder Bay Judo Club), who did very well, especially Jamie who won bronze and Lilly who won gold and also received a trophy for fastest throw (1 second into her match!). Congratulations Jamie and Lilly! Congratulations also to Nikki Woodbeck on the Shuniah team who took home a bronze in her category.

The hall was at capacity, filled with coaches, competitors, and families. Athletes were tense and eager to fight after 3 years of covid lockdown that hampered any local tournaments. The event lasted over 6 hours with competitors patiently waiting their turn as organizers struggled with the high enrollment.

Luke Woodbeck surprised the crowd with a powerful Seio Nage throw on his opponent. For this move, the judoka must grip the opponent's left lapel and right sleeve, turn so their back is against the opponent and then pull the opponent forward over their shoulder.

Beatrice Zappe's third opponent went in for Osoto-Gari, which is a foot sweep to lift her right foot and upset her balance. She stepped back

with her left foot and confidently pulled him over her right leg winning the match.

Eva Woodbeck was paired with a higher-level opponent, our friend Rowan, who attends McKenzie School and occasionally practices at our club. Though Rowan was dominant in the end, Eva did a great set up for Tai Otoshi, a move where you block both legs of the opponent and then pull him over your extended leg. Rowan escaped but, Eva managed to hold off his attacks for over a minute by defending confidently in both standing and grappling positions. Charlotte Zappe managed to counter her orange-belt opponent's set up and bring him to the mat. She then started the set up for a Kesa Gatame hold down. This hold is called 'scarf hold' and is also used in Brazilian Jujitsu as an

Chase Marion's second opponent attempted to throw him by using Osoto Gari to sweep out his right foot. He managed to shift his weight to the left and pull her backwards off balance using a Tani Otoshi counter move to win the match. Chase really proved himself in this competition. He won a series of fights and had to keep standing to take on the next challenger. He really put his judo knowledge and his determination to good use.



The mid-April snow survey measurements remain above average for this time of year (1974 to 2022). Measurements taken on April 17, 2023 recorded between 15-36 centimetres of snow, compared to the average of 7-27 centimetres; water content measured between 68 - 131 millimetres of equivalent water content, compared to the average for the same period of 21 - 85 millimetres. The previous record was set in 2022 with 64-107 centimetres snow depth and 220 to 325 millimetres water content measured for the same time period.


