Smoke and CO Alarm "Blitz"

SHUNIAH FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES by Neil Parsons

On Saturday July 22, eight officers from the Shuniah Fire and Emergency Services Department conducted a Smoke and CO Alarm "Blitz" at a number of neighbourhoods and one RV Park.

Each residence, when the appropriate individual permission was granted was checked for a working Smoke/Co alarm and that each was in working order and properly placed. In some cases, batteries, free of charge were provided when necessary and if the situation warrantied then a combination Smoke/CO alarm was provided and installed on a loan basis. A number of owners had alarms that were over 10 years old (dates are on the back cover) and it is a sensible guideline that they are replaced after 10 years.

If the homeowner did not have either, they were strongly encouraged to buy one without delay-not only are you breaking the law but you are putting you and your family at risk!! There exists a substantial fine for non-compliance that can be issued at that time if the Officer deems it necessary.

A few owners of larger RVs thought that they had a separate CO alarms but when it was examined it was found to be a propane leak detector and again they were encouraged to buy a CO or a combination Smoke/CO alarm without delay or a loaner was provided.

When the results were examined, it is evident that more and more homeowners have properly installed and working detectors but our aim is and should be 100%.

Thank you to all the individuals who allowed us into their homes and treated us with so much courtesy.

Water Testing



The Thunder Bay District Health Unit recommends regular testing of your private well is important to make sure your water is safe for you and your family to drink. Bacteria such as E. coli can contaminate your well making is unsafe to drink. The risk is higher if you have animals in the area – especially on farms with livestock and other animals – but the bacteria can also occur naturally in the soil.

Heavy rainfalls or flooding? Additional testing is recommended as there is a greater risk of surface water washing into your well (drilled or dug). **How to get a kit?**

Free bacterial testing is available for private well owners through Ontario's Public Health Laboratory (the Lab), located at 336 South Syndicate Avenue. The Lab does not test for other contaminants, such as chemicals. Kits are available both at the Shuniah Municipal Office and the Lab itself. **For Further Information**

Municipality of Shuniah's 150th year of Incorporation SHUNIAH

March 29, 1873: The Ontario Legislature passed an Act to organize the Municipality of Shuniah consisting of the Townships of Pardee, Crooks, Blake, Paipoonge, Neebing, McIntyre, MacGregor, McTavish also Village of Prince Arthur's Landing,

Thunder Cape and the islands north of the American border. Hence, Shuniah became the first incorporated municipality in what is now the northwestern portion of Ontario. Peter Johnson Brown was elected as the first Reeve of the Municipality.

Over the years, as the population grew the individual townships became incorporated and as of 1976 the Municipality of Shuniah was changed into the Township of Shuniah consisting of the MacGregor and MacTavish wards.

I am of the opinion that one way to test how we are doing garden-wise is to have an outside opinion or commentary on not only how we as members are doing, but also how successful is our produce harvest in the coming weeks. I had taken this same effort a few years back with a Garden Walk-About. I have a former paper mill co-worker friend who not only was/is an avid gardener but he got that way because his father had an established organic farm west of Kakabeka Falls. So where do I find another one of these wise garden gnomes....well....pretty close and just down the road. It was my pleasure to work with his father who was a foreman in the finishing room at that same paper mill.

Larry Hansen of Shuniah, also has a veggie farm at Pass Lake called LarryLand. It took a few complimentary words to convince him to do another one of our Garden Walk-Abouts. A date was established and a newsletter sent out for a Monday evening convenient to all. To make a point of compliment from

his point of view from our picnic table....We had the envy of his eye. The Walk-About is a friendly discussion/observation of any garden as to soil quality and care (weeds), soil tests, nutrition, produce selection, seed spacing, produce growing success. I took notes of any comments/questions at each garden (yes...notes at 34 gardens) and we were (surprised) to learn that zucchini plants have male and female flowers....how to properly trim the tops and bottoms of tomato plants to more energize the fruit. Potato plants could be harvested in several ways...If you want small potatoes then harvest early, the later the plants stay in soil, the larger the yield. Things like that.

Our Soil Mates are tremendously pleased with the overall garden success this year. One main factor that we all felt was the key, is the large dose of 19-19-19 fertilizer in the spring and two weeks later began planting..the soil was then refurbished from last year's harvest.

The LRCA declared a Level I Low Water Condition for the LRCA Area of Jurisdiction on August 3, 2023. This declaration is based on one-month and three-month received precipitation and observed flow conditions in area streams when compared to the lowest average summer flows. Affected residents (households utilizing private wells) are advised to monitor their water levels and usage, as they may experience shortages if the lack of precipitation continues into the fall.

A new Pay and Display unit has been installed at Silver Harbour Conservation Area, replacing the coin box. Visitors to the Conservation Area are required to pay their \$5.00 per vehicle day-use parking fee (including utilization of the boat launch) via the pay and display or have a valid Explore Card Parking Pass visible in their windshield. Payment compliance is enforced by LRCA Provincial Offences Officers as part of Section 29 Regulations under the Conservation Authorities Act.

The Silver Harbour Dive Park is now officially open! All certified scuba-divers are welcome to utilize the newly developed Lake Superior access point (located approximately 130 metres east from the parking lot) for safe access and egress to the lake. Scuba Diving is not permitted in the boat launch area.

The LRCA still has some spots available at our upcoming fall Watershed Explorer programs. Space is limited and pre-registration is required. To register, visit www.store.lakeheadca.com. Programs are possible thanks to the generous support of the TD Friends of the Environment Fund.

Autumn is a wonderful time to explore a Conservation Area. The falls colours will be starting soon, and the weather will be cooling off which means less bugs. If you plan on visiting us this fall, we would like to remind all visitors of the \$5.00 per vehicle fee.
