Join us for Council Meetings!

In 2024 there have been three regular meetings of Council, January 9, 2024, January 30, 2024 and February 13, 2024.

On January 9, 2024, at our Regular Council Meeting, Council reviewed and adopted the Asset Retirement Obligation Policy and reviewed the Draft 2024 Budget. Council also, passed a by-law for an agreement with CRC Communications regarding communications equipment, Council passed a by-law to exempt the New Ambulance Base from property taxes.

On January 30, 2024, at our Regular Council Meeting, Council received a report regarding potential road name changes due to the Highway 11/17 twinning, Council scheduled two town hall meeting dates for July 10, 2024 and October 24, 2024, and Council passed the 2024 budget.

On February 13, 2024, at our Regular Council meeting, Council discussed plans for a Councillor Roads Tour of the Municipality, Council also discussed delegation topics for the upcoming Ontario Good Roads Association Conference in April. Council reviewed and discussed the municipalities Recognition of Employees 25th Anniversary and Retirement Policy and signed an agreement with Valard Construction for use of a municipally owned piece of property for the Waasigan Transmission Line project.

The next Council meetings are scheduled for February 27, March 12 and 26 and April 9, 2024.

Shuniah Public Works - Winter Safety Message

SPRING 2024

As spring approaches the public is advised to exercise caution in and around area waterways. High flows, melting ice and unstable banks could be dangerous. Parents and caregivers are advised to keep children away from all waterways and discuss the hazards of flooding and fast flowing water.

ANNUAL SPRING LOAD RESTRICTIONS will be in effect from March 11th until late May as a means to try to protect the integrity of the roads during the spring thaw. Please keep this time period in mind if you are planning to have building supplies or gravel products delivered to your property.

Illegal Dumping of Yard Waste and Debris

Residents are required to dispose of yard waste and debris at the Shuniah Landfill Sites, not alongside roadways and trails that lead into the bush that are quite often private property. If you don't want the material in your yard chances are neither do your neighbors.

The Thunder Bay **District Health Unit** recommends "regular testing of your private well"

Heavy rainfalls or flooding? Additional testing is recommended.

Testing

It is recommended that homeowners have their well water tested for non-bacterial environmental contaminants by a private laboratory approximately every five years.

Free bacterial testing is available for private well owners through Ontario's Public Health Laboratory (the Lab), located at 336 South Syndicate Avenue. The Lab does not test for other contaminants, such as chemicals.

SHUNIAH FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Spring Fire Safety (from the and thanks to, the Ontario Association of Fire Chiefs)

SPRING CLEANING:

- ensure that your "fire #"/address is visible from the road and remove any debris that could obstruct the view of First Responders
- clean out filters from above your stove
- test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, replace batteries and if the unit is more than 10 years old replace the entire unit
- make sure you have an emergency preparedness kit in case of power outages or floods
- pull out the fridge and vacuum the coils (unplug it first)
- plan and practice your home escape plan. Make sure the windows can open and that stairs and passage ways are free from obstruction
- check outdoor electrical outlets and appliances for animal nests
- get rid of old newspapers, magazines and junk mail(they have a tendency to accumulate and can help a fire grow)
- remove leaves and trash from carports and garages (these combustible materials are dangerous when close to hot automobile components)

OPENING THE CAMP OR COTTAGE:

- visually inspect the power lines leading to your cottage. Are tree limbs too close? If so, have them cut back (if necessary by a professional). This should be done before turning on the service to your cottage
- propane appliances that have been sitting for the entire winter can be hazardous if they are not maintained properly. Have them serviced by a qualified technician.
- have a working smoke/CO alarm outside any room or area designated for sleeping
- have a fire extinguisher. Response times for Fire Departments can be lengthy depending on the location of your cottage. Big fires start small and MAY be extinguished before they destroy your cottage. Place extinguishers by the exit so you have the option of leaving if the fire is growing too fast. If the fire is too big-LEAVE. Let the professionals handle it. It is recommended that you use a minimum of 10lb ABC extinguisher for your cottage.

2024 Budget and Property Taxes

The Council of the Municipality of Shuniah has ratified the municipal budget for 2023 which sets out the new tax rates and provides the approval to move forward with operating services and capital projects for the coming year. In these times of significant inflation and rising interest rates, our goal is to minimize the impact of property tax increases while ensuring that the services the Municipality offer can be sustained. The Municipality also needs to forecast for future commitments by preparing a multi-year budget that focuses on sustainability and includes reserves for infrastructure and potential fluctuations in operating expenditures. Council set a special budget meeting on December 12, 2023, for public input. The agenda for this meeting included a detailed line-by-line budget, draft budget memo, a 10-year summary of revenues, expenses, and reserves, 10-year capital forecasts for both Fire and Roads. All these reports are still accessible by visiting our website at shuniah.org. Council passed by-law 30-24 on January 30st to adopt the 2024 budget and rates of taxation.

The 2024 Shuniah Budget includes a 5.93% tax levy increase.

While the total 2024 levy increase is 5.93%, we attribute approximately 0.68% to growth in new property assessment (new construction) within Shuniah. The net increase to the Municipal Levy (after growth) if comparing to other Municipalities is approximately 5.25%.

The property taxes on every \$100,000 of assessment will be \$832 in 2024 compared to \$803 in 2023.

Example, the property taxes on a property in Shuniah with a MPAC assessed value of \$370,000 will be \$3,077 in 2024 compared to \$2,971in 2023. (this includes both municipal and education taxes)

Inflation has also contributed to the increase in the costs of items in the budget such has increase if fuel, supplies, and labour. The rehabilitation of Lakeshore Drive which includes new culverts over the next couple of years and full rehabilitation between 3 and 5 years.

Impact of changes to property assessment values:

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is responsible for determining the assessed values of all properties in the Province of Ontario with a province-wide assessment update every four years. The last province-wide assessment update took place in 2016, based on a January 1, 2016, valuation date. Property assessments are still set from the 2016 - 2020 assessments which are the comparable value for 2020 unless there is new construction, renovations, or reassessments on individual properties. New assessments will be in the future once the province sets the assessment date for MPAC to proceed.

LRCA staff have continued to conduct bi-monthly snow surveys at the three historical snow survey locations (Hazelwood Lake, Vibert Road and Madeline Street). As of February 15th, snow depth and water content continued to be well below average for that time of year with depth ranging from 14.6-15.8 centimetres (65 % below average) and water content ranging from 44.8-46.6 millimetres (50% below average). Lake Superior's beginning of February level was 2 centimetres below the beginning of February average and 21 centimetres lower than the level last year. The Level II Low Water Condition remains in effect for the LRCA Area of Jurisdiction.

MNRF's snow monitoring data is now available to the public through the Ontario GeoHub. The site contains information including a list of all active and historical snow survey locations, mapping of snow survey locations as well as historic and current snow survey data (1933 – 2023).
