Summer Student Employment – Shuniah Summer Day Camp Supervisor

The Municipality of Shuniah is currently seeking applications for ONE (1) Shuniah Summer Day Camp Supervisor who will focus on youth programming and recreation.

Position Summary:

Under the general guidance and direction of the Community Services & Events Coordinator (CSEC), the Day Camp Supervisor will maintain regular communication but must demonstrate the ability to work autonomously, in a safe and respectful manner, while performing various tasks as required.

Responsibilities:

- Plan and facilitate day camp programming for youth
- Identify strengths and gaps in day camp programs and propose new solutions
- Organize & develop work plans, project budgets and schedules with support from the CSEC
- Share weekly program and work plans, attendance and notes with CSEC
- Support the Day Camp Counselor hiring process (review resumes, co-deliver interviews, and provide notes to the CSEC)
- Support the CSEC in training the Day Camp Counselors the week prior to the start of Day Camp programming

Qualifications:

- Currently enrolled in program focusing on experiential education, outdoor recreation, hospitality & tourism, recreation & leisure studies or similar and intends to return to school on a full-time basis during the next academic year;
- You are between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of employment; a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident, or person on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*; and is legally entitled to work;
- Must have a valid driver's license and access to a reliable vehicle;
- A satisfactory criminal record check and vulnerable sector search
- Have current Standard First Aid/CPR Certification or willingness to obtain;
- Knowledge of Health & Safety Standards;
- Ability to organize & develop work plans, project budgets and schedules
- Ability to work without direct supervision as well as integrate experiences within a team;
- Open communicator;
- Passion for creating fun, safe activities for children and families.

Duration:

The Supervisor will commit to 7-10 hours of program planning and training in May-June, 2026. Staff training will take place in the last week of June, 2026. Shuniah Day Camp programming will begin the first week of July, 2026 and run until mid-August, 2026. Staff are expected to work 8-9 hours per day.

Winter Safety Message

Snow Removal Information:

The following information is provided to assist residents of Shuniah in understanding the Municipalities program for winter maintenance of roads. We hope that this information will also help people appreciate some of the challenges in keeping the roads safe and open for travel.

When a major snowstorm occurs, all drivers throughout the Municipality are faced with deteriorating driving conditions at the same time. Without consideration to the limitations of a snow maintenance operation and regardless of the weather, we understand that drivers expect all roadways to be cleared and safe within the shortest possible period of time. We agree that rapidly cleared roads are very important, both for safe travel, and to facilitate the handling of emergencies by fire, ambulance and police operations.

The plow operators are assigned a designated route, of which may contain several classes of roads- class 3 roads are considered the major routes and class 5 roads are considered to be the lower volume lightly traveled roads. The routes are designed to clear roads in a systematic way that generally gives priority to class 3 roads and class 4 - 5 collector roads with steep hills and curves. This method also provides the best access for Emergency Services.

The municipality is required to follow Ontario Regulation 239/02 Minimum Maintenance Standards for Municipal Highways .

These maintenance standards including the level of service to be provided are based on the classification of a particular highway/road. Speed limits and traffic volumes determine their classification. Current municipal roadway traffic volumes do not meet the set criteria for Highway Classes 1 & 2 therefore, all of the road classifications fall within the range of 3-5.

The minimum standards for winter maintenance include but are not limited to:

5	once every 30 days

Fire Prevention ~ Winter Safety Tips ~ by Neil Parsons

We are spending more time indoors. Our homes have carbon based heating systems that are in nearly constant use in our cold weather (any device that uses or burns a carbon based fuel- propane or natural gas, coal, gasoline and diesel heaters,gas appliances and wood burning stoves and fireplaces). CO (Carbon monoxide) the silent and deadly killer is produced through incomplete burning(combustion) of these carbon based fuels.

If you have an attached garage, never leave your automobile running. It is a very good idea to have a working (in every sense of the word) smoke and CO alarm on every level of your house. Recent changes to the Ontario Fire Code will dictate that every level of your home must have a working smoke and CO alarm. Check it and if it is older than 10 years, get a new one immediately.

Dispose of ashes in an airtight metal container with a tight lid and immediately place outside (not the garage) away from any flammable material. Don't burn gift wrapping paper etc as they burn too rapidly and generate too much heat

Take great care using Fire Salts (dry powder which produce different colour flames (other than the regular and naturally occurring yellowish flame) when thrown on wood fires. They contain heavy metals and cause intense gastrointestinal irritation and vomiting when ingested. Keep away from children and pets.

Always use a screen in front of the fireplace to protect from flying sparks
Use only seasoned dry wood

Never leave the fire unattended or let it smoulder.

Have a 3 feet kids free zone around an open fireplace and space heaters. And keep anything that can burn (a common culprit is to store your wood close to your wood stove or fireplace-do not do that) 3 feet away from your fireplace, stove or heater.

Be alert- if you are sleepy or consumed alcohol do not use the stove or stovetop

The specific course of action (including salting and sanding) will be determined by the Roads Supervisor, depending on snow depth, type of snow, drifting, icy conditions, etc. It is the Municipality's objective to plow all roads within 12 hours of a snowstorm's completion. In cases of heavy snowfalls, accidents, mechanical breakdowns and / or other problems, these objectives may not be met.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why do plows push snow into driveways? Why can't the operator lift the blade in front of my residence?

Answer -Snow must be pushed to the side of the road to clear the road for traffic; all plow trucks are set up to push snow to the right. Sometimes it is necessary to make several passes with the snowplow during a storm. Other instances may require the banks to be pushed back to allow room for more snow or to allow for drainage during the spring thaw.

Homes that are located near corners, intersections and cul-de-sacs may receive more snow deposit in driveway entrances than homes located on straight stretches of road, of which is unfortunately un- avoidable in most instances.

Why can't the Municipality sand the sides of the road where I walk?

Answer – Roads are maintained for vehicles, not walkers. The sanders are designed with the applicator on the driver's side of the vehicle in order to apply sand to the center of the road.

Mailboxes & Snow

- Mailbox posts need to be sturdy enough to handle snow thrown by the snowplow.

If a mailbox is damaged by plowed snow, repair or replacement is the homeowner's responsibility.

- Mailboxes that have been directly hit by a snowplow blade will be repaired or replaced by the Municipality with a standard mailbox.

Obstructing the Roadways

Council passed By-law No. 2051-01, which states that, no person shall obstruct or cause any obstruction to any highway, roadway, public lane or bridge within the Municipality. This by-law also indicates that snow, dirt, rubbish or garbage of any kind cannot be placed or plowed onto the roadway and drainage ditches.

If you are cooking, stay in the kitchen.

Keep anything that can catch fire, oven mitts, wood utensils, towels away from the stove top Grease and fat fires are the leading cause of house fires in Canada. This is what should be done if grease in a pot or pan catches fire.

-smother the flames by covering the pan with a lid. Do not remove the lid until the pan is completely cooled.

-use baking soda (flour can be explosive) on shallow grease fires.

-never turn on the overhead fan, as this could spread the fire.

-never throw water on a grease fire.

Please contact the Municipal Office for more information or with input into any of the items that Council is considering. This article contains only highlights from Council meetings.

On October 28, 2025, at our Regular Council Meeting, Council received a deputation from ABO Energy regarding an energy generation and storage project in the community. Council discussed and planning delegation they wanted to request at the ROMA Conference and Councillor Smith was appointed to the Thunder Bay District Social Services Board for 2026. Council declared 4 municipal Properties as surplus and available to be sold and TBayTel Mobility is looking to install a new Cell Tower on Lakeshore Drive.

On Wednesday, November 12, 2025, Council held a public meeting for two zoning amendment applications, for a sauna in front on the main dwelling and to re-zone 6 properties from Mobile home Residential to Community Residential that were inadvertently included erroneously due to a mapping error in Zoning By-law 2038-00.

On Wednesday, November 12, 2025, at our Regular Council Meeting, Council approved the addition of a full-time machine operator position for the public works department and awarded a tender for a Hydraulic Tree Shear. Council received a report regarding the MSO-NORTH 2025 Planning Workshop that was attended by staff and approved staff to put in an order for FoodCyclers for residents. Council received a report from the CAO regarding the information gathering process and next steps for the IESO LT2 requests. Council received information from Councillor Blunt regarding the New Conservation Authority News and Council passed a resolution supporting Improving Safety and Connectivity Through 2+1 Highway Development in Northern Ontario

On November 25, 2025, Council held a Regular Council Meeting, Council had a delegation from Environment North and a from Environmental Defence Canada regarding peaker plants. Council approved 2 zoning by-law amendments and signed an updated agreement with circular materials for municipal recycling, Council approved staff to proceed with the implementation of Voyent Alert as a community notification system and Council decided to not issue a Municipal Support Resolution for the IESO's Long-term 2 procurement window. Council discussed the LRCA proposed changes and put forward a resolution regarding the opposition to the proposed changes.

On December 9, 2025, Council held a public meeting for two zoning amendment applications, for a sauna in front of the main dwelling and to allow for a garage to be on a property without a main dwelling for up to 3 years.

On December 9, 2025, at our Regular Council Meeting, Council appointed Councillor Blunt as the Acting Mayor for 2026, Council received a report from the Community Services and Events Coordinator regarding events that were held in 2025 and information regarding events in 2026 and Council supported the 2026 Thunder Bay District Social Services Administration Board ROMA Position Papers.

Reminder Council meetings are held the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of each month.



Threats to wildlife

- animals can become dependent on artificial food sources
- animals can lose their natural fear of humans and pets, becoming more prone to conflict
- artificial feed is not healthy for wildlife
- wild animals may gather in large numbers when they are being fed — this concentration of animals in one area can spread parasites and disease and cause destruction of natural habitat
- feeding animals near roads increases their risk of being hit by

Threats to people

- feeding wildlife may attract "unwanted" animals to your property
- animals will learn to associate humans with food, and can become a problem to neighbours
- habituated animals can become aggressive
- feeding animals near roads increases the risk of motor vehicle accidents, resulting in property damage, injury or death.

Water Testing Reminder

The Thunder Bay District Health Unit...

...recommends "regular testing of your private well is important to make sure your water is safe for you and your family to drink. Bacteria such as E. coli can contaminate your well making it unsafe to drink. The risk is higher if you have animals in the area, but the bacteria can also occur naturally in the soil."

Heavy rainfalls or flooding? Additional testing is recommended as there is a greater risk of surface water washing into your well (drilled or dug).

How to get a kit?

Free bacterial testing is available for private well owners through Ontario's Public Health Laboratory (the Lab), located at 336 South Syndicate Avenue. The Lab does not test for other contaminants, such as chemicals.

Free bacterial testing kits are available for pick up at the Municipal Office at 420 Leslie Avenue.

Testing

Water samples submitted for bacterial testing to Ontario's Public Health Laboratory are not tested for metals or chemical contaminants that could affect the safety of drinking water.

It is recommended that homeowners have their well water tested for non-bacterial environmental contaminants by a private laboratory approximately every five years.


